In the light of the growing importance of the topics of migration and integration in public discourse on a local, national and international level and the increasing politicisation and mediatisation of the debate, policy-makers are evermore called to formulate an adequate response to challenges posed by the movement of people.

In its 10th annual conference, the Luxembourg National Contact Point of the European Migration Network brings together researchers and policy-makers to reflect on the role research has in providing knowledge that supports stakeholders in their task of formulating effective and coherent migration and integration policies and programmes.

Following a keynote speech, a first panel will discuss the role of evidence in policy-making in today's migratory context, the challenges that are set to researchers and policy-makers in dialogue and the ways in which these can be overcome.

A second panel will discuss the role of evidence in decision-making for integration in the context of Luxembourg, considering the challenges and successes of collaboration between those who provide evidence and those who design policies.
